Raga of the Month- December, 2010- GOPIKABASANT.

Raga Gopikabasant, adapted from Karnatak Music, is *a janya* (derived from) <u>Melakarta</u> Natabhairavi (<u>That</u> Asavari). The scale of <u>That</u> Asavari is S R g M P d n. In Raga Gopikabasant Shuddha Rishabh - R- is dropped in <u>Aroha</u> (Ascent) as well as <u>Avaroha</u> (Descent). Thus, the scale of Raga Gopikabasant reduces to S – g M P d n. It will be noted that, omission of R, transforms its scale such that it has shades of two melodious Ragas, Malkouns (S g M d n) and Bhairavi (S r g M P d n). Although there is a Raga named <u>Gopikavasanta</u> in Karnatak Music,Raga Gopikabasant of Hindustani Music, has resemblance to Raga <u>Hindolavasanta</u>. (Ref.
