Raga of the Month- January, 2011- Mangaltodi.

<u>That</u> Todi has a scale consisting of S,r,g,m,P,d,N notes. Raga Todi is characterized by phrases S,r,r->g, g->r, gr, S; Srgmd, Nd, NdP, mdmgr, grS. Raga Todi is also called Miyaki Todi, which implies that the melodious structure of present-day Todi is of recent origin. In the ancient texts, one finds <u>Melakarta</u> Hanumatodi, of which Bhairavi is the equivalent <u>That</u> in Hindustani Music. We, therefore, find few Ragas with Teevra Madhyam 'm' in Todi Family, such as, Miyaki Todi, Gujari Todi, (Bhoopal Todi- in which 'm' is dormant); as compared to the number of Ragas with Shuddha Madhyam 'M', such as, Bilaskhani Todi, Bahaduri Todi, LakshmiTodi, MotakiTodi, etc.

The raga MangalTodi, presented here, is a unique combination having both the madhyams, 'M' and 'm'. The prominent madhyama is, of course, Teevra madhyam 'm'; however, there are subtle touches of Shuddha madhyam 'M', in the form of phrases –mdndPMMd and SMMd – which greatly enhance the beauty of the Raga. The raga is presented by Late Pandit Ram Marathe.

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
