Raga of the Month- February, 2018

Hemangini/ ShuddhaRanjani

Raga Hemangini/ ShuddhaRanjani is an example of a Raga adopted from Carnatic Music. It belongs to Melakarta No. 57- Simhendramadhyama. It is a Sampoorna-Sampoorna Raga and its scale consists of notes S,R,g,m,P,d,N. ; Ragas Simhendramadhyama and MadhuBasant are scale-congruent with Hemangini. Raga MadhuBasant resembles Madhuvanti in Poorvanga and Basant in Uttaranga, hence, has a distinct melody structure. Only few audio samples of Simhendramadhyama and Hemangini are available and as such, they are in a phase of evolution.

Raga Hemangini- Aroha 'NSRg, mP, dNS"; Avaroha- S" NdP, mg, RS;

Vadi R Samvadi P; Time 4 to 7 p m;

Chalan- 'm'd'NS, SRgm, gmP, mgRs.; SRgR, RgmP, mdP, gmPdP, mdNdP, mPdNS", S" NdP, mPdNdP, mgR, gRS; SRgmP, mdP, mPdNdP, gmPNS", S" R"g"R"S", g"R"NdP, mdP, mgR, gR 'NR 'N 'd'P, 'm'P'd'NS.

It will be noticed that the scale of Raga Hemangini resembles some Ragas closely, such as, Todi (has Komal Rishabh r in place of Shuddha Rishabh R in Hemangini), Madhuvanti (has Shuddha Dhaivat D in place of Komal Dhaivat d) and Kirwani (has Shuddha Madhyama M in place of Teevra Madhyama m).

The Raga has been documented by Pandit Manikbuwa Thakurdas in the 3rd volume of his book Raga Darshana.
