Raga of the Month- Jan, 2013

MadhKouns / Anupriya.

There are many Ragas in Hindustani Classical Music ending with the suffix Kounstheir common characteristics being i) a pentatonic scale- having 5 notes; ii) generally consist of Shuddha Madhyam and Komal or Shuddha notes of Gandhar, Dhaivat and Nishad in different combinations, and some have 5 notes in Aroha and 6 or 7 notes in Avaroha. There are examples of Kouns varieties having both Shuddha and Komal swaras. Raga MadhKouns falls under that category.

Raga Madhkouns is a mixture of Raga Jog and MalKouns, although it has a distinct melody structure. Raga MadhKouns can be considered as Raga MalKouns with addition of Shuddha Gandhar or Raga Jog with Pancham replaced by Komal Dhaivat -d-. Its scale consists of S,g,G,M,d and n, Shuddha Gandhar -G- being used in Aroha, Komal Gandhar -g- being used in Avaroha and successive use of 2 tones of Shuddha and Komal Gandhar in Avaroha as G->g->S enhances beauty of the Raga.

Raga MadhKouns: Chalan
