## Raga of the Month-November, 2012-

## TanseniMadhuvanti.

From the name itself it is clear that the Raga TanseniMadhuvanti is based on the platform of Raga Madhuvanti. Madhuvanti is a Raga of recent origin. It is learnt that well known Sitar Maestro Ustad Vilayat Khan composed the Raga Madhuvanti and Pandit Wamanrao Padhye of Kolhapur also conceived a similar melodic structure and assigned the name Ambika to it. Komal Nishad –n-, if at all used, is used sparingly in Avaroha in Raga Madhuvanti and Ambika to enhance the beauty of the Raga.

In Tanseni Madhuvanti, both Nishads –N- and –n- are used effectively and one after another in Avaroha, to create a distinct melodic effect. The Raga uses the scale of Melakarta No. 59 Dharmavati i. e. S,R,g,m,P,D,N with the addition of Komal Nishad –n-. If we feed these notes in the sub-menu "Find Scale-congruent Ragas" of the website, we get 5 Ragas; namely DhanawarchiKalyan, MadhuMalhar, Ambika, SaraswatiRanjani and VidyapatiKalyan. Audio samples of the Ragas Dhanawarchi Kalyan and MadhuMalhar are available on the web site for comparison.

The chalan (Sample melodic combinations) of the Raga Tanseni Madhuvanti is given below;

- S, 'NS, 'P'NS, S 'N'n'D'P, 'P'NS (m)g (S)RS, Sgmg, m-g (S)RS;
- S, Sgm-g, gmP, mPmg, gmPnDP, PNnDP, mP (g)mg (S)RS;

SgmP, gmPN, NS", Ng"R"S", R"S", PDNS" nDP, S" NnDP, mDP, mg, mg (S)RS.
